

COMMUNITY RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN 2040 ENGAGEMENT REPORT

MAWWFRS has published its Community Risk Management Plan (CRMP) 2040 Engagement Survey Report, marking a significant milestone in shaping the future of fire and rescue services across the region.

The report, based on extensive public and stakeholder engagement, captures the voices of over 728 respondents and reflects the priorities, concerns and aspirations of communities across Mid and West Wales. It forms a cornerstone of the Service's long-term vision to deliver the best possible service for the communities it serves.

#BURNTOPROTECT

The Wales Wildfire Board are encouraging farmers and landowners to #BurnToProtect the Welsh countryside this burn season.

As the long, hot summer comes to an end and we transition into autumn, with dry vegetation and a reduction in temperatures, burn season officially gets underway.

The Wales Wildfire Board want to remind farmers and landowners that burning heather, grass, bracken, and gorse can take place from 1 October up until 15 March (up to 31 March in Upland areas), however, they must have a Burn Plan in place to ensure they are burning safely.

By working together with communities to share knowledge, the Wales Wildfire Board hope to provide a better understanding of what we can all do to limit accidental fires from happening and in turn the damage they can cause to our environment.

medical attention. A fellow runner and friend of Darren's, Lee Nicholson, was the first at the scene and raised the alarm before performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) until help arrived.

Darren and Lee visited Builth Wells Fire Station to thank all the emergency services who helped Darren. The visit highlighted the fantastic collaboration between all services to achieve a positive outcome.

On Thursday, September 25th, Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service hosted its annual More Than Just Fires Awards at Parc Y Scarlets in Llanelli.

The evening was hosted by beloved broadcaster Eleri Siôn best known for her warmth and energy on BBC Radio Wales, BBC Radio Cymru and S4C. The night was a special opportunity to give thanks and recognition to the remarkable efforts, hard work and dedication by Service staff over the last 12 months.

The ceremony included a total of 10 award categories made up of nominees who had been chosen by their colleagues. It included an award

for Community Champion, Top Fundraiser and the Chief Fire Officer's Special Recognition Award, to name but a few.

Speaking during the ceremony, CFO Roger Thomas KFSM said:

Community Champion Award

The first award for Community Champion went to Crew Manager Steven Richards for his courageous response to a medical emergency near his home. Steven has since championed bleed control awareness, installing bleed control kits at Llanelli Fire Station and the Llanelli Masonic Hall.

Also shortlisted were Firefighter James Boyle of Swansea West Fire Station and Firefighter Douglas Preece of Presteigne Fire Station



Top Fundraiser Award

The Top Fundraiser Award went to the crew at Presteigne Fire Station for their exceptional commitment to fundraising – raising over £6,700 in 2024 for the Fire Fighters Charity and over £3,000 in 2025 for local suicide prevention charities.

Also shortlisted were Firefighter Rhys Fitzgerald of Kidwelly Fire Station and the Blue Watch Crew from Neath Fire Station.



Outstanding Teamwork Award

The Pensions Team won this category, recognising their resilience and dedication in navigating complex pension changes. A small team who've supported staff with clarity and care through decades of legislation.

The United Kingdom International Search and Rescue Team is on call 24/7, 365 days a year and are ready to respond to humanitarian disasters across the globe. Since 1992, the team has been deployed to major incidents in countries including Turkey, Haiti, Nepal, and most recently, Morocco, following the devastating 2023 earthquake on Al Haouz Province.



Amman Valley Fire Station

In the face of an unimaginable emergency, the crew from Amman Valley Fire Station displayed extraordinary courage, compassion and professionalism. Responding to a maternal cardiac arrest, they supported crews from the Emergency Medical Retrieval, Transfer Service and The Welsh Ambulance Service Trust in performing an emergency caesarean section on scene. Their calm and decisive actions helped save the life of a newborn child.

Station Manager Bleddyn Rees is also recognised for his exceptional leadership and unwavering support he provided his crew during and after the incident.

As the evening came to a close, it was evident that More Than Just Fires is far more than an awards ceremony - it's a heartfelt tribute to the people who make Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service truly exceptional. PIECE OF FIREFIGHTING HISTORY PUT ON PERMANENT DISPLAY

On Monday, August 11th, a presentation was held at Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service's (MAWWFRS) Headquarters in Carmarthen, to unveil a recently restored hand operated firefighting pump.

Over the past few months, work has been undertaken to restore an historic Merryweather & Sons hand operated firefighting pump, after it had been stored in an outbuilding for almost 40 years.

The Merryweather four-person hand pump was commissioned in 1906 by Lord Drummond of Edwinsford Mansion, near Llandeilo, Carmarthenshire. The pump was procured following a serious haybarn fire on the Edwinsford Estate the previous year.


The pump has been carefully restored by former MAWWFRS Officer, Rob Rayner, and is kindly onloan to MAWWFRS by its owners, retired Dyfed Fire Brigade Officers Eric Barnes, Arwel Fowler, Donwy Williams and Dyfrig Williams. The pump now takes pride of place in MAWWFRS's Conference Centre, where it will remain on permanent display as a historical exhibit















FRENCH FAMILY ASSISTED BY CONTROL CENTRE FIREFIGHTERS

In May 2025, the Joint Fire Control Centre in Bridgend, which is responsible for dealing with emergency calls for both Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Service and South Wales Fire and Rescue Service, received a call from a French family in distress.

Thanks to the seamless collaboration between Control Firefighter Chris Morris and Crew Manager Caroline Hughes, the team was able to respond swiftly and effectively. Caroline, who is fluent in French, was able to communicate directly with the caller and establish that the child had sustained a laceration to his head.
