Fireworks

The Welsh Fire and Rescue Services recommend you attend an organised display.

Don't:


- Don't go back to a lit firework

 even if it hasn't gone off it could still explode.
- Don't throw fireworks or put them in your pocket.
- Don't drink alcohol if you are setting off fireworks.
- Don't use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire.

Do:

- Keep a bucket of water nearby.
- Store fireworks in a closed box and take them out one at a time.

- Follow the instructions on each firework. Use a torch to read them not a naked flame.
- Light fireworks at arm's length, using a taper.
- Make sure everyone stands well back.
- Always supervise children around fireworks and never give sparklers to children under five.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- · Keep pets indoors.
- Only buy fireworks marked BS7114.



Celebrations


Don't

- Don't place candles near a Christmas tree or materials that can catch light easily.
- Don't attach decorations to lights or heaters as they can burn easily.
- Don't leave cooking unattended.
- Don't let Christmas tree light bulbs touch anything that can burn easily, such as paper or fabrics.

Do:

 Check your Christmas lights carry the British Standard sign and replace any bulbs that blow.

- Make sure that any visitors and additional family members know how to escape in an emergency.
- Always switch Christmas lights off and unplug them before leaving the house or going to bed.
- Test the batteries in your smoke alarm every week. Never remove them.
- Keep candles away from children. Make sure that they are extinguished properly when you leave the room.
- Take time to check on elderly relatives and neighbours at times of celebration as they are at greater risk from fire.



Sky (Chinese) lanterns

We do not recommend the use of Sky lanterns. They are a fire risk to property, crops, vehicles and livestock and can harm the environment. However, if you do intend to use a lantern please consider the following advice.

Don't:

- Don't use a damaged lantern.
- Don't release lanterns in urban areas.
- Don't release lanterns in areas containing animals or growing crops.
- Don't launch a lantern near a road or public highway, especially major roads and motorways.

• Don't launch a lantern if the wind is stronger that a light breeze.

Do:

- Make sure the launch area is kept clear of flammable materials.
- Launch lanterns away from obstacles such as trees, electricity and telephone power lines or buildings.
- Check wind direction and speed before launch.
