

A new Chair and Deputy Chair have been elected to lead Mid and West Wales Fire and Rescue Authority over the next two municipal vears.

At the Fire Authority's Annual General Meeting on Monday, June 9th, 2025, Councillor John Davies of Pembrokeshire was elected Chair and Councillor Matthew Crowley of Neath Port Talbot was elected Deputy Chair.

Speaking on his election as Fire Authority Chair, Cllr John Davies said:


LLANDEILO FIRE STATION DRILL NIGHT



After an incredibly busy grass fire period, where between March and May 2025, Fire and Rescue Services across Wales have seen an increase of 407% in the number of wildfires when compared with the same period last year, the Wales Wildfire Board is reminding you to be #WildfireWise this summer.

The Spring and Summer months carry with them a real set of dangers if you do not follow practical and correct safety advice appropriate for this time of year. The Wales Wildfire Board is encouraging everyone to be Wildfire Wise and commit to simple precautions and a little extra care, to ensure we can continue to enjoy our beautiful countryside and keep our communities safe from the devastating effects of wildfire.

During this time of year, grass and mountains can become very dry, which means if you deliberately or accidentally start a fire outdoors, it will spread very quickly, destroying everything in its path.

While damage to land and property is immediate and visible, the repercussions of wildfires can extend into public health, economic stability, and environmental sustainability, causing lasting and impactful effects on community wellbeing and prosperity.




